The College of Southern Idaho has 59 students from 19 countries – not including refugees and part time students from BSU, ISU, and U of I. Keith advises them on a variety of topics such as immigration, health, and safety. The students volunteer in the community at places like Habitat for Humanity, the Bike Path at Rock Creek, etc. They also participate in fun activities such as the corn maze, pumpkin carving, and wood carving – which is very popular.

Students have some hefty requirements before being accepted – English proficiency, banking statements of \$15,000 (set by the state), certificate of financial responsibility, to name a few. The majority of graduates move onto a university.
